Technical Tips

Q: How do you troubleshoot an X-13 motor?

So, a quick recap. An X-13 motor is a constant torque motor that falls somewhere between a standard PSC and fully communicating ECM. lť s actually a DC motor with a programmed motor module attached to the end bell that provides control of the motor. It will have two inputs to it, line voltage and control signal "speed taps". Line voltage is typically present any time the unit is powered, and the control signal is sent on demand for fan operation. Some manufactures utilize a DC voltage signal between 9 and 23VDC, others utilize 24VAC.

Knowing there are only two inputs makes troubleshooting relatively easy.

Verify proper line voltage and ground to the motor, then verify control input signal. Yep, that's it! Too easy, eh? That's why we get the calls, technicians believe there must be more to it than two easy steps.

The rub is that there are 5 control signal taps on the motor module, and each can be programmed for a different operational characteristic. However, not all manufacturers use all taps, so if an input signal is provided to an "unprogrammed" tap, the motor may not run. If access to the manufacturer's literature is not available, try a different tap before you condemn the motor module.
