## **Candy Bar Community Fundraiser**

In the 1990s, real estate entrepreneur, Zachary Fisher and his wife established a foundation to provide financial assistance to members of the armed forces and their families. The Fishers devoted their Foundation's resources to construct 18 "homes of comfort" for military and veteran families to be close to a loved one who is in the hospital. Many times, wounded soldiers receive care at a VA Hospital or medical center that is not near their family. Faced with the burden of multiple nights in a hotel, family members can instead stay at a Fisher House which is located within walking distance of the treatment facility.

Today, there are 70 Fisher Houses located on the grounds of various military and veterans hospitals throughout the United States, Germany and the United Kingdom. Since the inception in 1990, Fisher House has served more than 277,000 families and saved them an estimated \$320,000,000 in lodging and transportation costs.

There are three Fisher Houses in the Bay Area. One in Palo Alto with 28 suites and

two more at Travis Air Force Base near Fairfield with a combined 23 suites.

Not having to worry about housing while military families help care for their recovering spouse, mom, dad, son or daughter is a great way for us to give back to our military community in the Bay Area.

## **Technical Tips**

#### Q: What Should I Look for During Fall Scheduled Service?

It's time for the seasonal scheduled service runs, and we all know there is more to it than changing a filter. A lot can be done during a scheduled service, and what is achieved is directly related to how much time is allotted...never enough in most cases.

For condensing furnaces, trap and drain maintenance is a must. No telling what type of bugs decided to climb through the pipe and set up shop. A slow draining furnace can cause nuisance pressure switch trips and marginal burner characteristics, which can lead to bigger trouble.

Burner inspection is equally important.

A spider web in the wrong location can cause ignition issues or poor burn. Thorough inspection is especially important with LP converted furnaces. While it may seem like a pain to remove the burner rack and inspect, it's a walk in the park compared to replacing sooted heat exchangers.

Check the vent system, ensure combustion air supplies have not been blocked, and inspect the return air duct connections for leaks.

Last but not least, ask the homeowner if they experienced any late season issues with the cooling system so you can make a note for next spring.
