Technical Tips

Q: When does 4 equal 10?

You're on a "No cooling" call for a residential split system with a TXV. It's hot, the unit has been down 2 days and it's 85 degrees inside. You replace a bad capacitor and the unit starts. The suction line feels warm so you gauge up and find the superheat high, with the subcooling at 4 degrees. The unit data tag shows the subcooling should be 10 degrees. Looks like a low charge so refrigerant needs to be added, right?

The correct answer is "it depends on the conditions". To accurately charge a system with a TXV the indoor temperature should be between 70 and 80 degrees. "Why?" - you ask. High indoor load conditions drive a TXV wide open, attempting to reduce superheat. With the TXV wide open the subcooling appears to be low, when in fact it might be normal for the conditions.

In these situations, patience is key. Allow the system to operate 10 to 15 minutes and recheck your numbers. Don't let high indoor conditions result in an overcharge. Once the indoor temperature drops to 76 degrees the superheat drops, the TXV backs off, the subcooling increases to 10 degrees. In this case, 4 equals 10. Resist the urge to add refrigerant with indoor temps above 80.
