Technical Tips

Q: I added refrigerant and it didn't help – now what?

When witnessing relatively low liquid and suction line pressures a technician is typically inclined to add refrigerant and "get the head up." This is not always the proper solution.

First, determine the type of indoor metering device being used. Second, place temperature probes on the suction and liquid lines to determine superheat/subcool.

Since 2006, a majority of split systems installed use TXV metering devices. If the bulb begins to lose its charge, the valve may not open properly. On a properly charged system, symptoms associated with this situation are

are typically low liquid and suction line pressure and high superheat/subcool. Adding refrigerant results in an overcharge, little change in suction pressure, and eventually excessive high side pressure as the condenser is filled beyond its holding capacity

Take time to put temperature probes on the lines to get a more accurate assessment of the conditions *prior* to adding refrigerant. There's no sense in adding refrigerant to a system that you may eventually be recovering!

Also, to reduce recovery time, ask about the new CPS Pro-Set MT69 submersible subcooler.
