

## **Technical Tips**

#### Q: How can I have a "No cool" service call because of a heating problem?

In the Bay Area, we're now in the time of year where you can get service calls for both "it's too hot" and "it's too With these Fall weather conditions (cool in the evenings and mornings with warmer daytime temperatures) systems are used in both modes. Don't assume "too hot" means the cooling isn't working, or "too cool" means the heating isn't operational. It could be a thermostat override/schedule adjustment left in place accidently. This is particularly true with zoning systems that have multiple thermostats.

With constant volume zoning systems, the unit can either heat or cool, but it can't do both. If a thermostat calls for heat first thing in the morning, but the heating system isn't operational, the zoning system may not shift over to the cooling mode until the heating "demand" has been satisfied. If the heating system isn't functional, the demand cannot be met and the system may not shift to cooling. Now you have a "too hot" service call.

If you are out on a "no cool" call at this time of year, don't forget to present the homeowner with the merits of a scheduled Fall heating system checkup. It might be odd, but talking about a heating system when it's 90 degrees outside is better than when it's 40!
